Six attend 161st Presbytery meeting to welcome Rev. Kane

A small group from Kirk in the Pines made their way to the University of the Ozarks in Clarksville, AR on Friday March 13th and Saturday March 14th to offer a warm Kirk welcome to Reverend Jeff Kane, the Kirk's new pastor. The Presbytery meeting was the official introduction of new ministers in the Arkansas region which included Rev. Jeff Kane.

Many of us were first time attendees. Not only was there an opportunity to meet new and old acquaintances, but informative educational workshops were offered. Blake Brinegar, Stated Clerk of the Presbytery and Presbyterian minister led a resource packed workshop on The Older Adult Ministry.

We also gleaned helpful information from the visiting vendor booths such as Ferncliff and the Synod Partnership for Disaster Recovery which targets church disaster preparedness and assistance.

It would not have been an Arkansas Presbyterian gathering without "calling the Hogs." That enthusiastic and spirited call was Rev. Kane's official welcome to Arkansas.

April 2 Maundy Thursday service to be a Tenebrae service

Tenebrae means "shadows" or "darkness" in Latin. Tenebrae services have been held since the Middle Ages. The service involves gospel readings from the Passion of Christ as well as music. Following each section of the service a candle is extinguished. When the last candle is extinguished, the church is in darkness.

The darkness that falls progressively on the church signifies the encroaching darkness falling on the world as Jesus proceeds toward the cross and death.

This service helps focus worshippers on the reality of Jesus' agony as he neared the place where he would be tortured and killed by crucifixion. Each section of the service represents the falling of one shadow after another across the path of Jesus and on all creation.

Maundy means "command" and is taken from the Gospel of John where, after washing the disciple's feet and the prediction of betrayal by Judas, he gives a new commandment. "A new command I give you: Love one another." (John 13:34)

Come, reflect, and remember Christ's sacrificial love experienced through this ancient service of remembrance.

According to Jennifer Allen, awards presenter and Village Voice publisher, "this award honors an individual in our community who goes above and beyond, someone whose service to others makes Hot Springs Village a better place for all of us."

Jim, a long-time member of the Kirk in the Pines, was one of three who received awards in this category. According to Allen, "Jim Patton is the very definition of community commitment. For more than a decade Jim has served on the Hot Springs Village Public Services Committee, two of those as chairman. Pastor's Corner

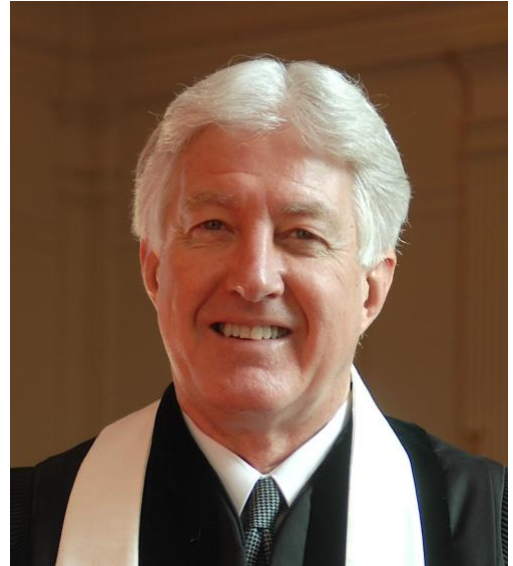
Dear Friends,

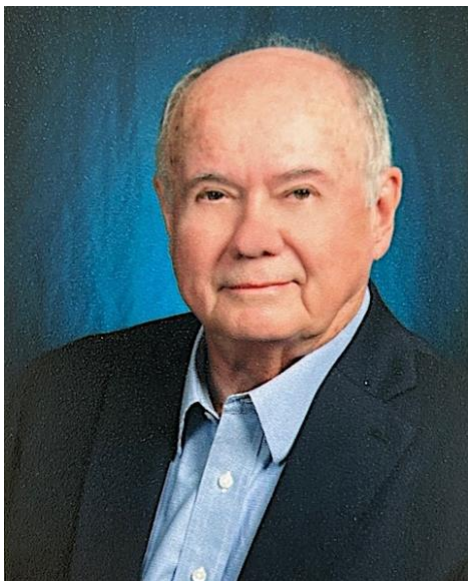

The "Kirkin", for short, has been a recurring event at the Kirk since 2006. It is a celebration of our Presbyterian heritage and a time to request blessings for our church and our families. It is the committee's sincere hope that this year's celebration will live up to the wonderful ones of the past. Please contact us with questions or suggestions.

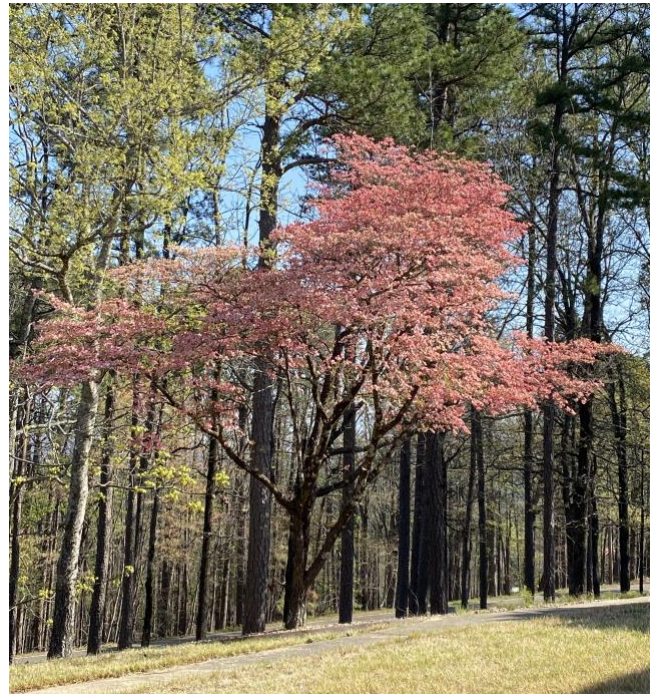

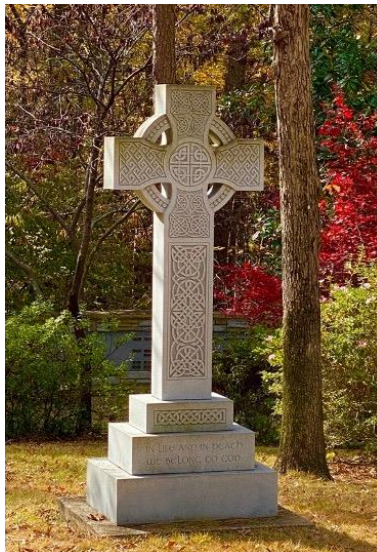
